Frozen foods get respect

The problem with buying a pack of fresh broccoli: you don't eat it all the same day. The longer it stays in the fridge, the more nutrients it loses. In one recent study, frozen broccoli had much more vitamin C content than broccoli that was refrigerated for five days. Another concern is how long it was refrigerated in transportation and at the store before you bought it.

Frozen food makers are taking products convenience another step. Recently, Birds Eye introduced Recipe Ready frozen vegetables that are pre-cut for specific dishes. It has sliced peppers and onions for fajitas and chopped carrots, onions and celery for chili, soup or stew. They say one of their goals as an industry is just getting people to eat more vegetables.



One New York chef says corn is especially good frozen. Add cheese for a kid-friendly dish. For cooking frozen peas, beans and other vegetables, he recommends adding them to a skillet on medium-high heat with oil, seasoning, and add 2 tablespoons of water. Cover until heated through and the moisture is evaporated.

Sales of frozen fruits are rising every year. They are boosted by the use of juicers, the popularity of smoothies and the use of fruits in compotes.

Senior Scene

Don't neglect hearing loss

About two-thirds of Americans over age 70 have some degree of hearing loss according to a study reported in the Archives of Neurology. Among those over 60, hearing loss accounted for a one-third higher risk of developing dementia and a greater risk of Alzheimer's disease.

Hearing loss may be related to dementia because of social isolation, which exhausts one's reserve of cognitive abilities, or deterioration of sensory nerve fibers. Wearing a hearing aid reduces the risk of social isolation and improves a person's quality of life.

Walk faster

An extensive University of Pittsburgh study over 21 years showed those with faster walking speed at the beginning were more likely to live longer, an association that was strongest after age 75. The median gait speed was 1.77 mph. Those who usually walked 2.25 mph (3.3 feet per second) or faster, consistently lived longer than expected.



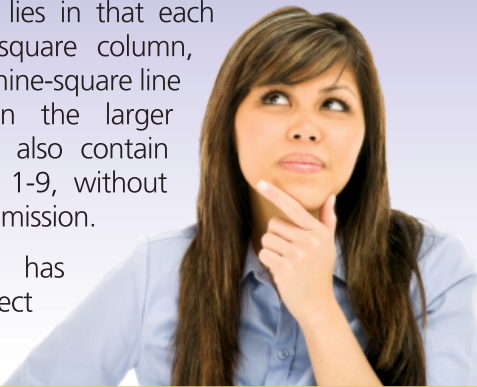

Baked French Onion Soup

2 cans of Campbell's Select Harvest caramelized French onion soup
2 packages garlic and cheddar croutons
2 cups shredded Parmesan cheese

2 teaspoons Pernod or Herbisant liqueurs (licorice flavored)

Divide the cans of soup into four portions, half filling four large oven-proof baking bowls. Add 1/2 teaspoon of the Pernod or Herbisant to each dish of soup and stir.

Float 5-6 of the croutons on the top of the soup. Layer 1/2 cup of shredded cheese over the croutons.

In a pre-heated oven at 350 degrees, bake the soup until the cheese has melted and is browning around the edges of the dish.

Baked onion soup, accompanied by a salad, can make an entire meal or just be offered as the soup course for a dinner or banquet.
