The professor picked up a box of sand and poured it into the jar. Of course, the sand filled up everything else. now, said the professor, "I want you to recognize that this is your life. The rocks are the important things - your family, your partner, your health, your childrenanything that is so important to you that if it were lost, you would be nearly destroyed. Easy Meatloaf

- 1 1/2 pounds ground beef
- 1 egg
- 1 onion, chopped
- 1 cup milk
- 1 cup dried bread crumbs

salt and pepper to taste
2 tablespoons brown sugar
2 tablespoons prepared mustard
1/3 cup ketchup

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F.

In a large bowl, combine the beef, egg, onion, milk and bread Or cracker crumbs. Season with salt and pepper to taste and place in lightly greased 5 \times 9 inch loaf pan, or form into a loaf and place in a lightly greased 9 \times 13 inch baking dish.

In a separate small bowl, combine the brown sugar, mustard and ketchup. Mix well and pour over the meatloaf.

Bake at 350 degrees F for 1 hour.
